Mission

One of the main objectives is to develop the capacity of students to understand social events and to produce critical solutions. Another goal is to provide a broad cultural background as well as an education that covers the basic theoretical issues and research methods of sociological analysis.

Vision

One of the main targets is to train sociologists who understand and explain their social realities and who have the necessary knowledge and skills, who have developed social responsibility in Turkey.

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Importance of Sociology Departments

Sociology, which is a branch of science that examines social structures and phenomena shaped by the impact of social, economic, political, and cultural changes, realizes this both theoretically and practically. Today, in parallel with the development of technology, family structure, economic activities, residential areas and in connection with these, the forms of relations in both private and public areas are changing. The examination of these changes is carried out through the sociology departments.

In particular, the increasing demand by both state and private institutions for research on social problems such as immigration and immigration, gender inequality, early marriage, addiction, honour killings, violence against women and children has increased the importance of sociology departments in solving social problems.

Why Department of Sociology?

Sociology is the science of the social interactions of society and people in groups. This is why sociologists explore the complexity of structure between cultures and societies and the dynamics of social systems. Therefore, we provide students who prefer our department with a broad knowledge of society, critical thinking skills, and the ability to evaluate and write about quantitative and qualitative findings.

We help students who prefer the sociology department develop their critical thinking skills, identify potential solutions to social problems, and train researchers and scientists who will work in this field.

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Job Opportunities of Our Graduates

Graduates of the Department of Sociology find a wide range of work in public institutions and the private sector. The first employment of Sociologists in the public sector was established in 2005. Since then, it has been possible to be appointed with the title of Sociologist or with different titles within the Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Family and Social Policies, Ministry of Health and Municipalities.

In addition, with the Philosophy Group Certificate and Teaching Formation they received during their undergraduate education, they can work as a Philosophy Group Teacher and Guidance Teacher in schools and private education institutions affiliated to the Ministry of National Education. In the private sector, our graduates can be employed in positions such as pollsters, researchers and consultants in public opinion research and consultancy companies.
